


Millionaires, marriage and murder make for a potent cocktail in this compelling tale set among the superrich of New York's elite.






Terms of Inheritance Michelle Upton


The Artist's Secret Alexandra Joel


Jacqueline in Paris Ann Mah






The Lego Story Jens Andersen


Devil Dogs Saul David




The Book of Burn Out Bey Aisbett


The Stars Did Wander Darkling Colin Meloy
