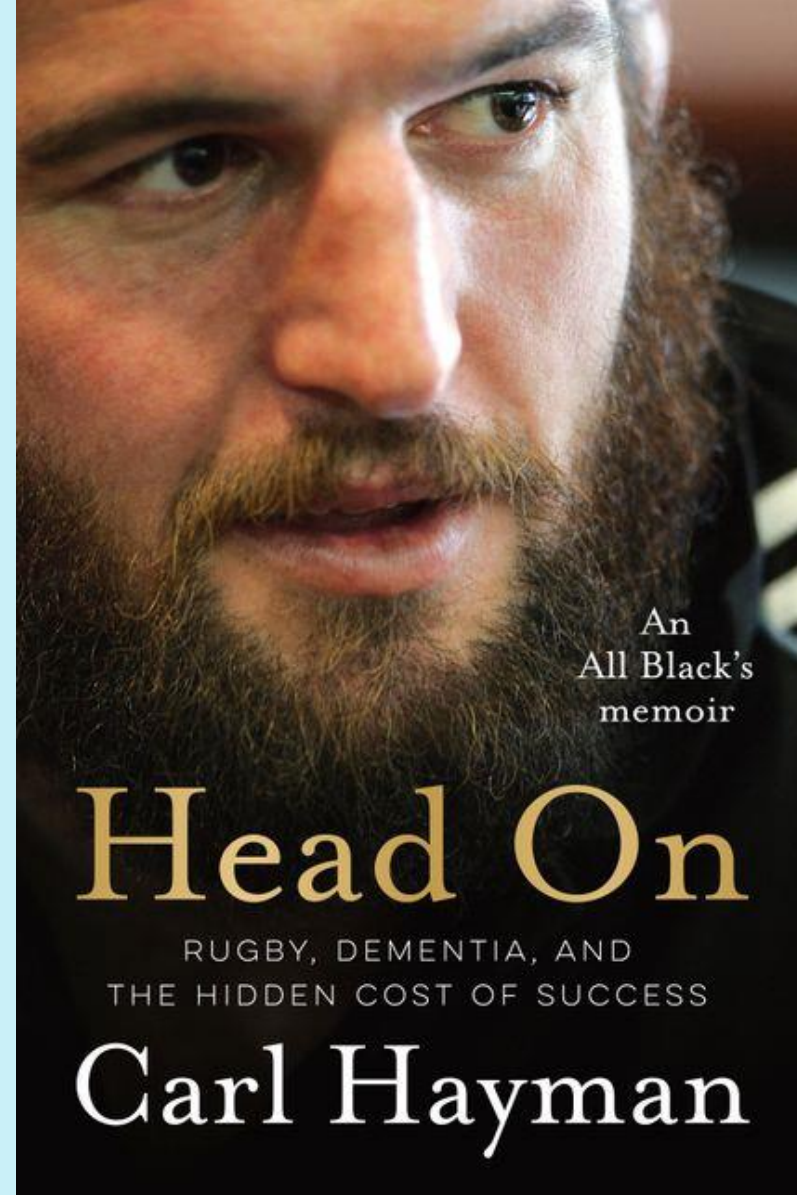

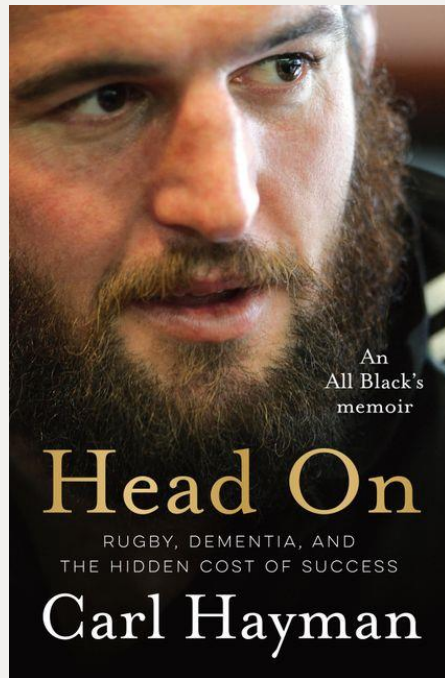

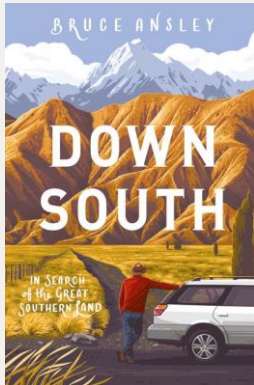
Rugby, dementia, and the hidden cost of success
