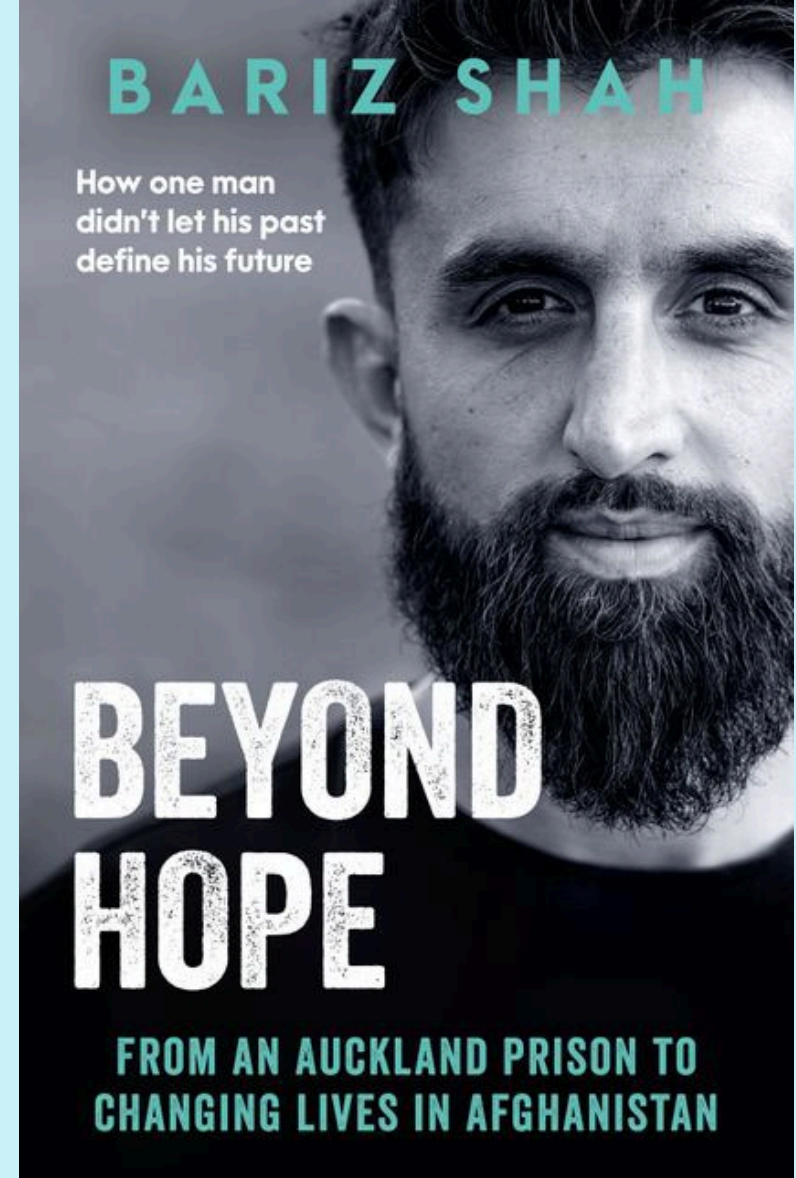

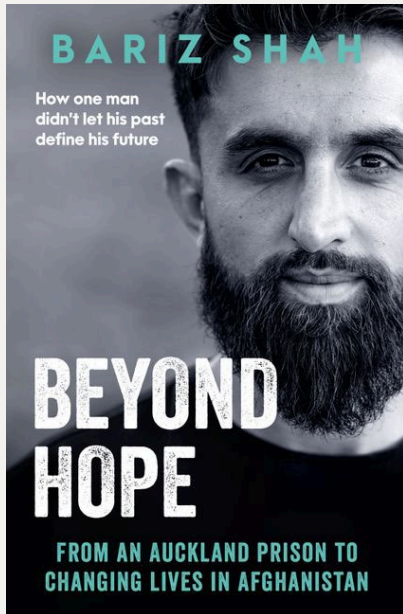

Beyond Hope Bariz Shah

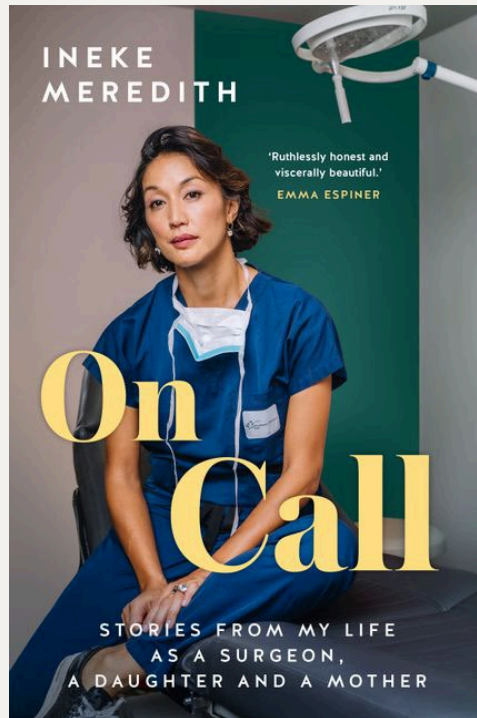
