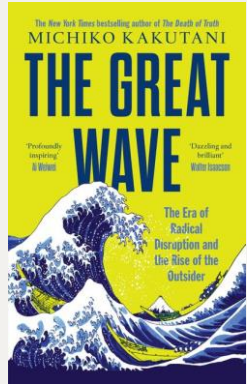
Run for your Life Sue Williams
